## Car seat use after a crash

# Contact the car seat manufacturer

Contact your **auto** insurance company

After any crash, it is important to call the car seat manufacturer for guidance on whether your car/booster seat can still be used.

Scan the QR code to find your car/booster seat manufacturer's contact information.

Contact your auto insurance company to find out if they will reimburse you for a replacement car/booster seat after a crash.

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) recommends that car seats be replaced following a moderate or severe crash. Car seats may not need to be replaced after a minor crash.

#### A minor crash is one in which ALL of the following apply:

- •The vehicle was able to be driven away from the crash site.
- •The vehicle door nearest the car seat was not damaged.
- •None of the passengers in the vehicle sustained any injuries in the crash.
- •If the vehicle has air bags, the air bags did not deploy during the crash.
- •There is no visible damage to the car seat.

NEVER use a car seat that has been involved in a moderate to severe crash. Always follow car seat manufacturer's instructions.
