3 Booster Seat	Children must ride in a booster seat until they are 8 years old or weigh 80 pounds or are 4 feet 9 inches tall (4'9").	347.48 (4)(as)3. Failure to provide/ properly use an approved child restraint system <i>Charging Statute: 347.48(4)(am)</i>
4 Seat Belt	Children must be restrained in a seat belt when they outgrow the requirements of a booster seat.	347.48(2m)(c) Failure to provide/ properly use seat belt
Back Seat	Children required to ride in a rear-facing or forward-facing car seat must be restrained in the back seat.	347.48(4)(as)1. and 2. Failure to restrain a child in the back seat <i>Charging Statute: 347.48(4)(am)</i>

Children can remain in each of these stages longer provided that their height or weight do not exceed the limits shown on the car seat manufacturer's label.

Law enforcement look for:

- Unrestrained children
- Children in a car seat in the front seat of a vehicle
- Wrong size/inappropriate car seat
- Loose or unsecured car seat
- Loose car seat harness
