

Safe Kids Worldwide 191,000 lives saved

Since its inception in 1988, Safe Kids has helped reduce the U.S. childhood death rate from preventable injuries by almost 60 percent. That's more than 191,000 lives saved.

Safe Kids works with more than 400 coalitions across the United States. Their teams implement grassroots programs by educating families, creating safer environments and advocating for improved laws to protect children.





Safe Kids Wisconsin plays an active role in leading the injury prevention effort here in our state. It currently serves as liaison between Safe Kids Worldwide and eleven local coalitions that provide safety education, support and programming to prevent childhood injury in our state. Safe Kids Wisconsin is led by Children's Wisconsin, one of the leading independent pediatric medical centers in the United States.

Each coalition is unique, because it is led by a local organization that serves the needs of its individual community. By forming a coalition, you will become part of a network of people sharing resources, data and best practices on child safety. You will form strong partnerships with local health departments, first responders, hospitals and agencies that care for kids.

Local coalitions implement public awareness, education, policy and community activities in ways best suited to solving the problems particular to their communities.

Local data, people power, resources and support to address your local needs

Some examples of the work our local coalitions do include:

- Car seat check events where trained technicians show parents and caregivers how to use and install their car seats correctly and ensure kids are in the right seat for their age and size.
- Pedestrian safety workshops in school communities that bring attention to safety issues and ensure that kids and drivers know to stay safe in school zones.
- Bike rodeos and helmet fitting events to promote safety when riding bicycles and other wheeled vehicles like scooters, skates and skateboards.
- Youth sports safety clinics.
- Fire prevention initiatives around smoke and carbon monoxide detectors in the home.
- Life jacket loaner stations and water safety initiatives.

Staff time

- Paid staff person serves as coordinator of injury prevention and health promotion efforts. (Recommended minimum 20 hours per week.)
- Attends at least half of our quarterly state coordinator meetings to stay connected, share ideas and network with the other coordinators in the state.

Fiscal agent

 Ability to take in grant funds and donations or fundraise if necessary to support and implement injury prevention programs.

Goals

- Completes a community needs assessment every three years, and sets goals/action plan based on that assessment.
- Contributes to the Safe Kids Wisconsin annual report.

Operational support

• Provides office space, administrative support and basic equipment.

Brand compliance

 Complies with Safe Kids Worldwide's brand guidelines and trademarked licensing requirements when producing program materials. Agrees to include the Coalition logo on all materials related to Coalition activities.
