 The water safety grant wrapped up in September. The water safety group was successful in building the life jacket loaner station at the McKinley Marina. Open water and boat safety education was provided in various communities and in a variety of settings this past summer. This group will start meeting again in the spring.

Trunk Junk is an educational campaign used to teach teens about emptying out the junk in their car and replacing them with safety materials. The kits include: educational and promotional materials, mini flashlights, ice scrapers, tire gauges, gift cards, jumper cables, first aid kits, and winter hats. Counterfeit car seat questions and comments:

- Do we have a program if parents come with these and need another car seat? Not currently.
- Distributors are responsible for these seats, even though they are not the manufacturer
- Parents will be frustrated if they purchase these seats
- Are the sellers providing car seat testing---
 - No, there is not testing
 - There are no weight or height limits on the seat/no labels/no certification, etc.
- Ratings---not allowed to take baby home from the hospital
